Diversity Hub has been developing and delivering leadership programmes for young people for many years. We focus the programmes on issues that young people tell us are important to them. We then train them in the skills and courage needed to lead their peers on some of the toughest issues facing society. Following training for staff and students, we provide ongoing support and coaching as the new in-school team takes leadership. Our approach ensures young people are at the heart of taking leadership to build community cohesion and we have won British Diversity Awards 6 years running for Best Practice in Education.

Diversity Hub Community Cohesion programmes include:

Friends Against Bullying: Provides schools with a whole-organisation anti-bullying strategy with the capacity to involve every member of the institution in working pro-actively for change. Within their own sphere of influence they work to put an end to bullying and its devastating consequences and build a culture that is welcoming to all.

Leicester Against Bullying: A similar programme to **FAB teams**, specifically for young people who are not in school and who want to get involved in creating change. The young people lead a wide range of anti-bullying activities including peer-led workshops.

Playground Mentoring Programme: For primary schools wanting to engage every young person in building a culture that is welcoming for all, and leaves no space for anyone to be excluded.

Champions Against Violence: Violence Prevention and Anger Management programme incorporating all the principles of **FAB** and **LAB** whilst addressing the tough issues facing young people and their behavioural challenges, and inspiring them to take leadership to end violence.

Community Facilitators and **Conflict Busters:** Young people involved in **FAB** or **LAB** who want to take their skills beyond their school into their communities. After receiving further in-depth leadership training they get involved in a range of initiatives including inter-generational and peer conflict resolution, stalls at carnivals and community events and delivering training.

"I really enjoyed FAB. I don't get bullied any more. I've helped others in the same situation – and those who are bullying. I am more confident and have faith in myself, and other young people. The conflict resolution skills have helped me with friends, family and neighbours when a situation needs resolving."
